### THE GETTY CENTER LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, USA

The Getty Center presents the Getty's collection of Western art from the Middle Ages to the present against a backdrop of dramatic architecture, tranquil gardens, and breathtaking views. The security and communication system is an upgrade from an old TouchLine system to AlphaCom. The system is used for movement control, stations are located at door entry points and at a guard located at the entrance of the museum that ties back to central control.



### THE SMITHSONIAN WASHINGTON, D.C., USA

The Smithsonian Institution is a museum and research complex of 18 museums and galleries and the National Zoo, as well as research facilities. The STENTOFON AlphaCom system here provides security for the museum with intercom stations located at all entrance and exit doors and delivery areas. The system is linked to the museum's access control and video systems for a complete security system.



### MUSÉE QUAI BRANLY PARIS, FRANCE

Dedicated to arts and civilisations from Africa, Asia, Oceania and the Americas, this huge museum is due to open in 2006. Zenitel CSS France has been chosen to provide a reliable security intercom solution, allowing audio contacts between 60 wall stations and a control station. To provide the solution, Zenitel installed an AlphaCom 138 exchange with 11 conversation channels in order to limit the system saturation risk, due to multiple calls simultaneously. On top of the customer's safety requirements, Zenitel faced design and art requests that led, uniquely, to stations with a special colour treatment.



### SFMOMA, SAN FRANCISCO MUSEUM OF MODERN ART SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA, USA

This museum uses the STENTOFON Bi-Way intercom system at their front ticket booth for communications. The Museum had two expectations for the communication system: quality sound and an aesthetically pleasing look that would fit the museum motif.
